

This program's assessment design is strong, including direct and indirect measures for each student learning outcome pulled at various key points throughout the curriculum.

This program uses a variety of direct and indirect measures per outcome that strengthen the understanding of student learning throughout the curriculum. Longitudinal analysis of student performance on each measure is provided, and the target thresholds are adjusted accordingly.

HORTICULTURE BSA


COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

This program collects several measures for each learning outcome. This includes multiple direct measures for each learning outcome that vary widely to capture student learning across their curriculum in written and oral formats using both long- and short-term artifacts.





Incorporating both direct assessment of students' products and indirect assessment using self-reported survey data, this program thoroughly provides the relevance between the outcomes and measures. Assessment results are reported and interpreted at the course section level, rendering specific and actionable plans to improve student performance on each measure.





LEARNING, DESIGN, AND TECHNOLOGY PHD MARY FRANCES EARLY COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

This program incorporates robust measures throughout their curriculum to assess student proficiency at critically evaluating the existing body of literature and applying contemporary principles of learning, design, and technology to their own practices.



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
CURRICULUM MAPPING

The Office of Assessment has encouraged programs to revise learning outcomes. as needed. and consider alignment with measurements throughout the curriculum. Now, as a helpful companion exercise curriculum review, and to strengthen program assessment practice, we invite all undergraduate majors to develop or update an existing curriculum map.


Want more info? The Office of Assessment will offer optional Curriculum Mapping tutorial workshops via Zoom in February and March (see dates and registration links to the right). Afterwards, program coordinators are encouraged to collaborate with program faculty to undergo the curriculum mapping exercise. We welcome the submission of completed curriculum map files along with the annual program assessment reports, due annually on October 1 in Xitracs.

GENERAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT FINDINGS

A comprehensive review of student work collected over four assessment cycles (2020-2023) suggests that students' critical thinking and written communication skills strengthen as they advance in coursework at UGA.
