
Bloom's Taxonomy

differentiate, organize, relate, compare, contrast, distinguish, examine,

Use information in new situations

execute, implement, solve, use, demonstrate, interpret, operate,

Explain ideas or concepts

classify, describe, discuss, explain, identify, locate, recognize, report, select, translate
